Peer Support Services

The ODSOS program's peer support specialists offer support and encourage access to treatment. The peer support specialists use knowledge from their own life experiences to help participants be responsible for their own recovery from opioid misuse or overdose.

Opioid Overdose Response Kits and Other Harm Reduction Materials

Peers provide training on the use of naloxone, a prescription medicine to reverse an opioid overdose and prevent death. The training is for high-risk individuals and for family members, friends and the associates of any person who is using and at risk of overdosing on heroin or prescription pain medications. After completing the training, attendees will receive a free naloxone kit. Peers also provide other harm reduction materials and resources.

Care Coordination

ODSOS has peers in hospital emergency rooms and in the community who assist recent overdose survivors and people with opioid or stimulant misuse. Peers connect the individuals to treatment services, community resources and a consistent point of contact if someone wishes to enter care.
