This is a 14.3% decrease from the 7 fatal overdoses YTD 2020.

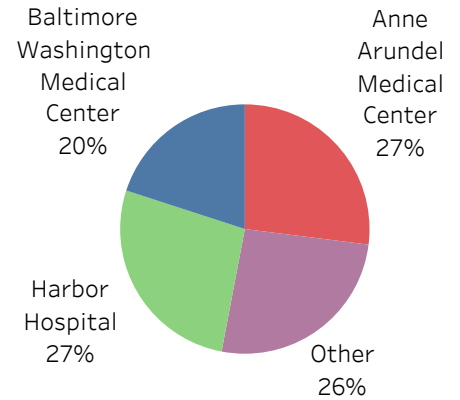

All overdoses in 2021 are still pending results from the Office of the Medical Examiner.

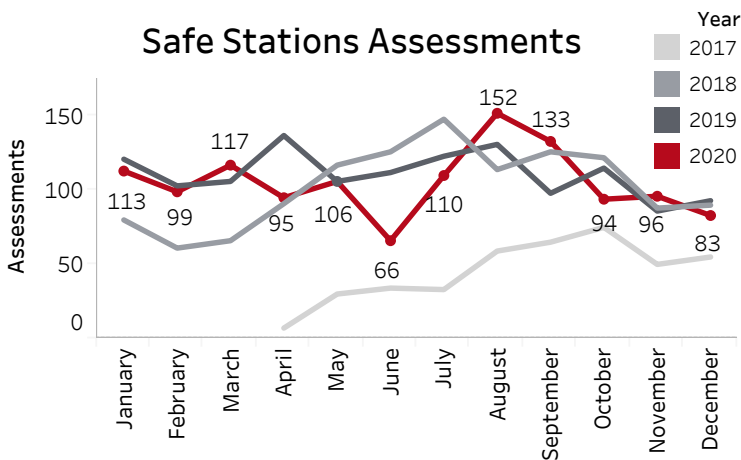

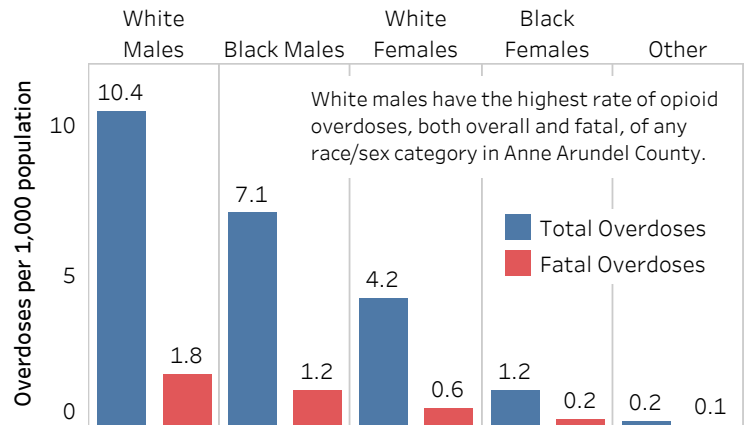
### Safe Stations Assessments

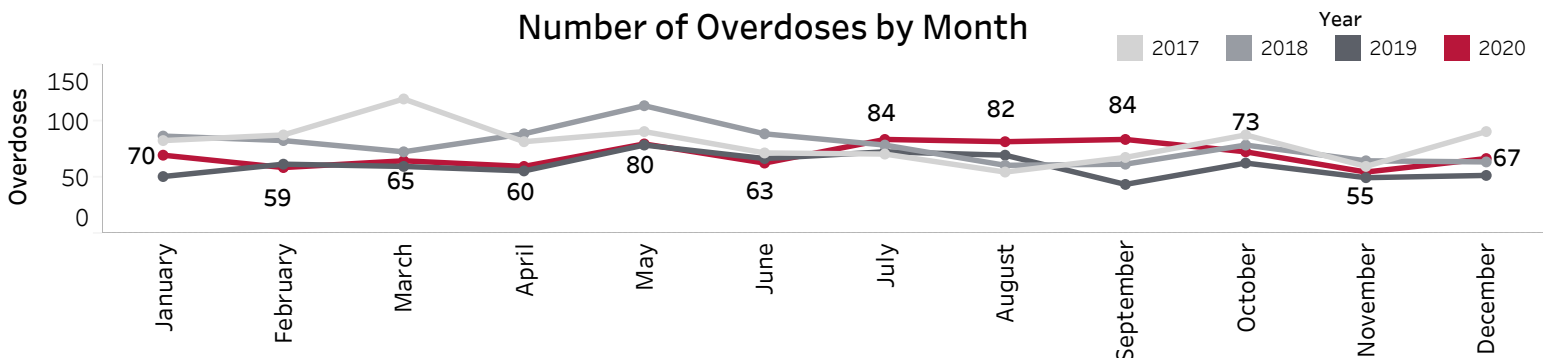
### Opioid Overdose Demographics
