This is a 28.0% decrease from the 107 overdoses YTD 2020.

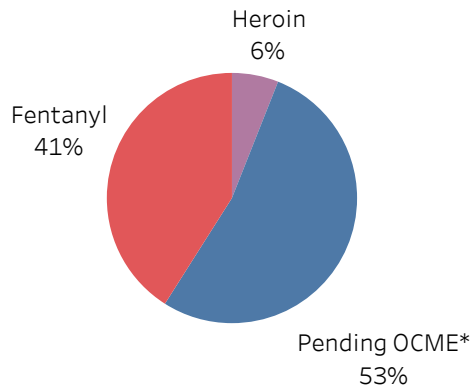

This is a 15.0% decrease from the 20 fatal overdoses YTD 2020.

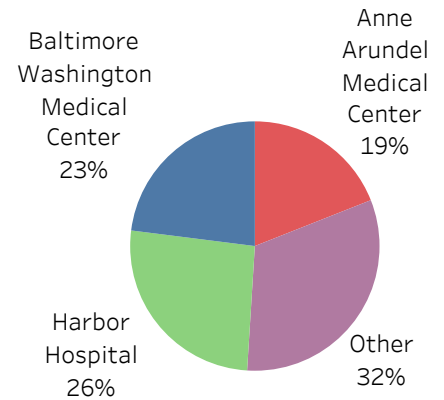

Substances Involved in Fatal Opioid Overdoses YTD 2021 (n=17)



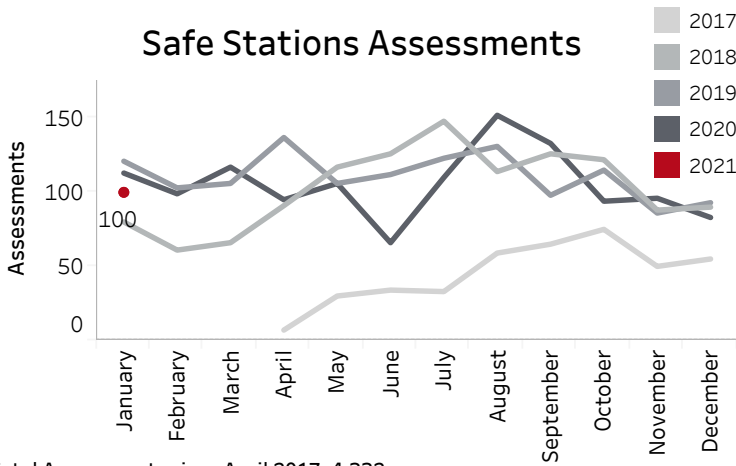

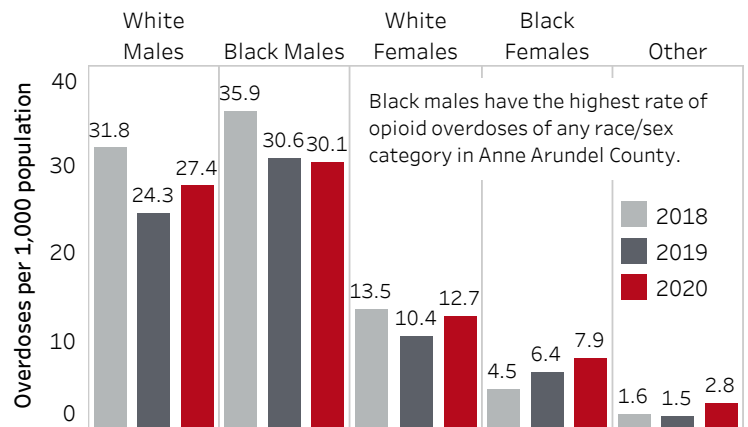

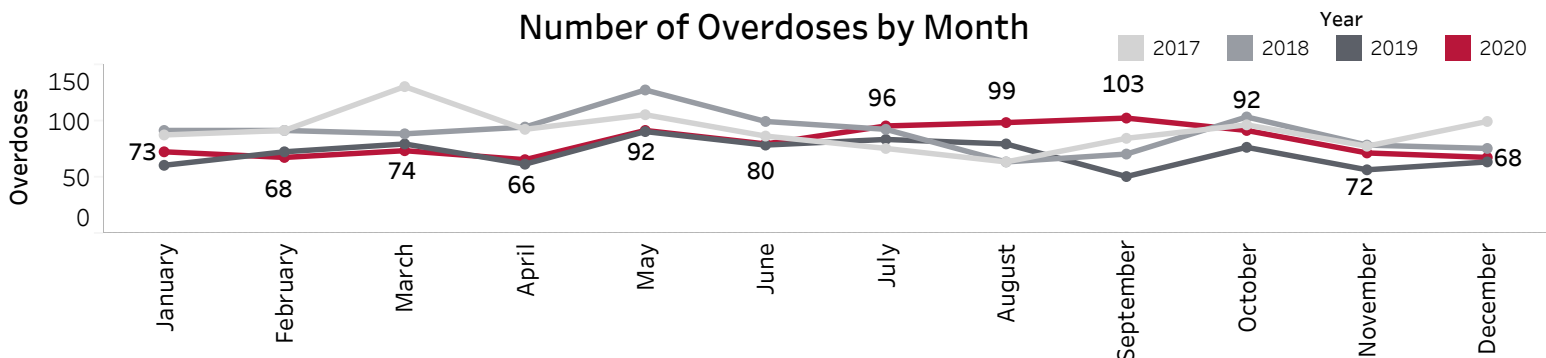
Opioid Overdose Demographics

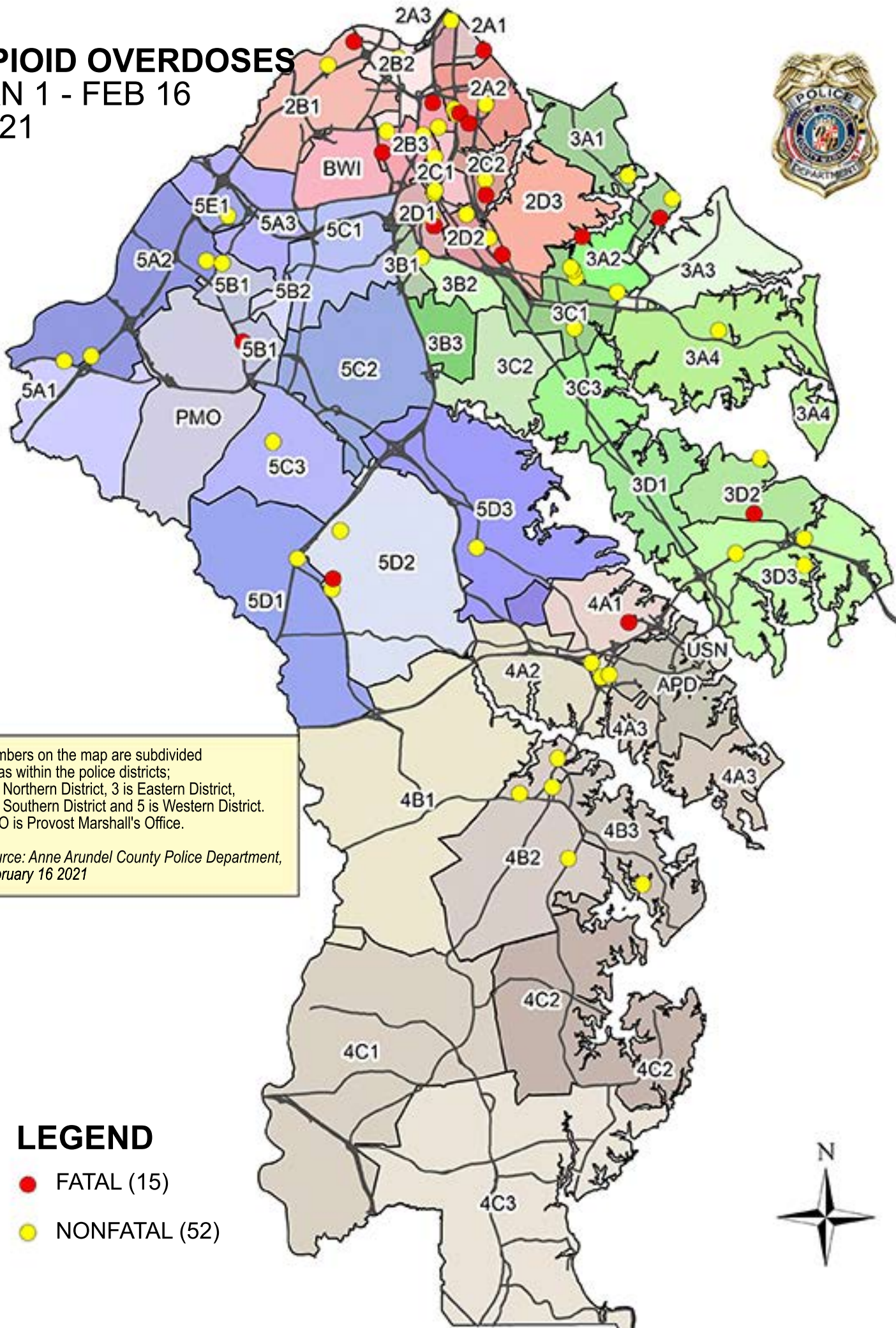
Number of Overdoses by Month
